Race Report by Tom Madden, Race Chair



"Snowbird" season nearly complete February, 2017

As February is in full swing I find myself thinking about spring and the warmer weather. This year has felt really wet and cold and I feel like we have not had a decent day since September.

So what is happening? On January 14, we held the third race in the Snowbird series for this season. The first two races were held in either gale force or near gale force winds. The third race forecast was for light winds, and I actually worried we might have to cancel for lack of wind. Although the morning forecast was for winds of 10 knots or less, they were predicted to fall off to nearly nothing in the afternoon.

As we set the starting pin buoy and got the committee boat anchored, we started looking at the conditions. We thought of a course using the lower hamburger buoy (now an STYC racing buoy) and making two laps, and actually set that course on the side of *Olele*. The wind was from the north at about 7 or 8 knots, but as the start time grew near, the wind began to die, so we changed to a shorter course using the entrance buoy to the locks and Meadow point twice around. If the wind really did die we could always call the race after the first lap.

The wind held at about 8 knots for the start, and all the classes of boats (there are 5 classes this time) got off without any issues. The wind held nicely for the first time around, and most of the boats had finished the first lap in under an hour. We let them go for the second lap, and the wind actually began to build. At this point I was wishing I had set a longer course, but it was too late to change, so we just settled for what is was.

In the end, all the boats that started, finished without any issues that we were aware of, with all the boats finishing with elapsed times between one and two hours. We had to DSQ one boat for going through the S-F line on the downwind leg when it was not specified as part of the course. My guess is they will never make that mistake again.
